

ATTENTION CHERRY VALLEY & ROCHDALE WATER DISTRICT CUSTOMERS

Be advised that effective October 5, 2020 the City of Worcester has declared a Stage 1 Drought-Water Supply Alert. Due to a lack of rainfall for much of 2020, the Worcester reservoir system was at 63% capacity as of October 1st. That level for October 1st is the trigger for a Stage 1 Drought following Worcester DPW&P's Drought Contingency and Water Emergency Management Plan.

As a consecutive system to the City of Worcester public water system, we are obligated to implement the same water use restrictions as are being implemented in the City.

Stage 1 Use Reduction Goal

The goal of use restrictions under a Stage 1, Water Supply Alert is a five (5) percent reduction in overall water use and public awareness of the drought.

- All outside non-essential water use is prohibited. This includes Irrigation of lawns, washing of vehicles, washing of exterior building surfaces, parking lot and driveways.
- We encourage all customers to identify and repair any leaks to private plumbing.

Under the District's Rules and Regulations, failure to comply with this mandatory restriction program will first result in a written warning. Subsequent violations can result in fines, the discontinuances of water service with a termination and restoration fee.
